The beautiful hymn, "We Plow the Fields," is often sung in the United States during the Thanksgiving holiday period in November. For me, it conjures images of families sharing a traditional feast during the harvest season. But I was surprised when I heard it sung in church during the month of June, far removed from its traditional holiday context. It reminded me that giving thanks to God for His goodness and provision is to be a continuing celebration for His people. For a special occasion of national celebration, King David wrote a song to guide his people in praising God on that day: "Give thanks unto the Lord, call upon his name, make known his deeds among the people....Glory ye in his holy name: let the heart of them rejoice that seek the Lord."

(1 Chronicles 16:8,10). But the song endured as part of Israel's songbook of ongoing praise (Ps. 105:1-15).

Two centuries ago, Matthias Claudius wrote:

WE THANK THEE THEN, O FATHER, FOR ALL THINGS BRIGHT AND GOOD; THE SEEDTIME AND THE HARVEST, OUR LIFE, OUR HEALTH, OUR FOOD; NO GIFTS HAVE WE TO OFFER, FOR ALL THY LOVE IMPARTS BUT THAT WHICH THOU DESIREST, OUR HUMBLE, THANKFUL HEARTS. ALL GOOD GIFTS AROUND US ARE SENT FROM HEAVEN ABOVE; THEN THANK THE LORD, O THANK THE LORD FOR ALL HIS LOVE.

We have so much to be thankful for every day. God continually provides for all our needs. So let's make Thanksgiving a year-long celebration.


# MISSIONARY OF THE WEEK

We began our service to the Lord as Zambian missionaries in June of 1995.
We moved from our home in Illinois to Zambia on January 22, 1998. We were first located in the city of Kitwe in the Copperbelt province of Zambia. There we worked with another missionary for 7 months. In August of 1998 after seeing the need in Ndola, the capitol of the Copperbelt province, we moved to Ndola to serve.
Calvary Baptist Church of Ndola is the first church that we organized. We are still working with this church trying to train leaders from the membership. It was not our intention to remain with the first church that we started, but various circumstances, including the sudden death of the Zambian pastor we had been training, has seen fit to keep us with Calvary Baptist. We are praying for the Lord to raise up a Zambian man who will be able to take over the pastorate.
