Moses – “drawn out” (2:10)  
• An outline of Moses’ life:

- 1<sup>st</sup> 40 years – Prince in Egypt – He saw his importance
- 2<sup>nd</sup> 40 years – Shepherd in Midian – He saw his impotence
- 3<sup>rd</sup> 40 years – Leader in the wilderness – He saw God’s omnipotence

Moses lived 120 years. His life is divided into three (3) equal parts of 40 years each.  
 First 40 Years . . . . He spent in Egypt trained in all the wisdom of Egypt.  
 Second 40 Years . . . . He spent in Exile (Backside of desert) going to God’s School.  
 Third 40 Years . . . . He spent being a Shepherd of God’s Flock, Israel, applying the wisdom gained in both of the former schools.

Moses spent First 40 Years learning He was **SOMEBODY**,  
 Second 40 Years learning He was a **NOBODY**,  
 Third 40 Years Finding out what God can do with **ANYBODY** surrendered to Him.

**Date:**

This book was written between 1445- 1400 B.C.

- The Israelites entered Egypt in 1875 B.C.
- They stayed 430 years ( Ex. 12:40; Gal. 3:17)
- The exodus took place in 1445 B.C.

**Theme:**

“REDEMPTION”

- Redeem is “to buy back out of the slave market”
- Exodus is to the O.T. what Romans is to the N.T.  
 Exodus gives a historical picture of redemption. Romans gives a doctrinal treatise of redemption.

Israel was redeemed....

- 1) By the power of God - They could do nothing to save themselves
- 2) By the means of a deliverer – Moses is a picture of our Deliverer, Jesus Christ.
- 3) Under the cover of blood – The blood had to be shed, and it had to be applied.

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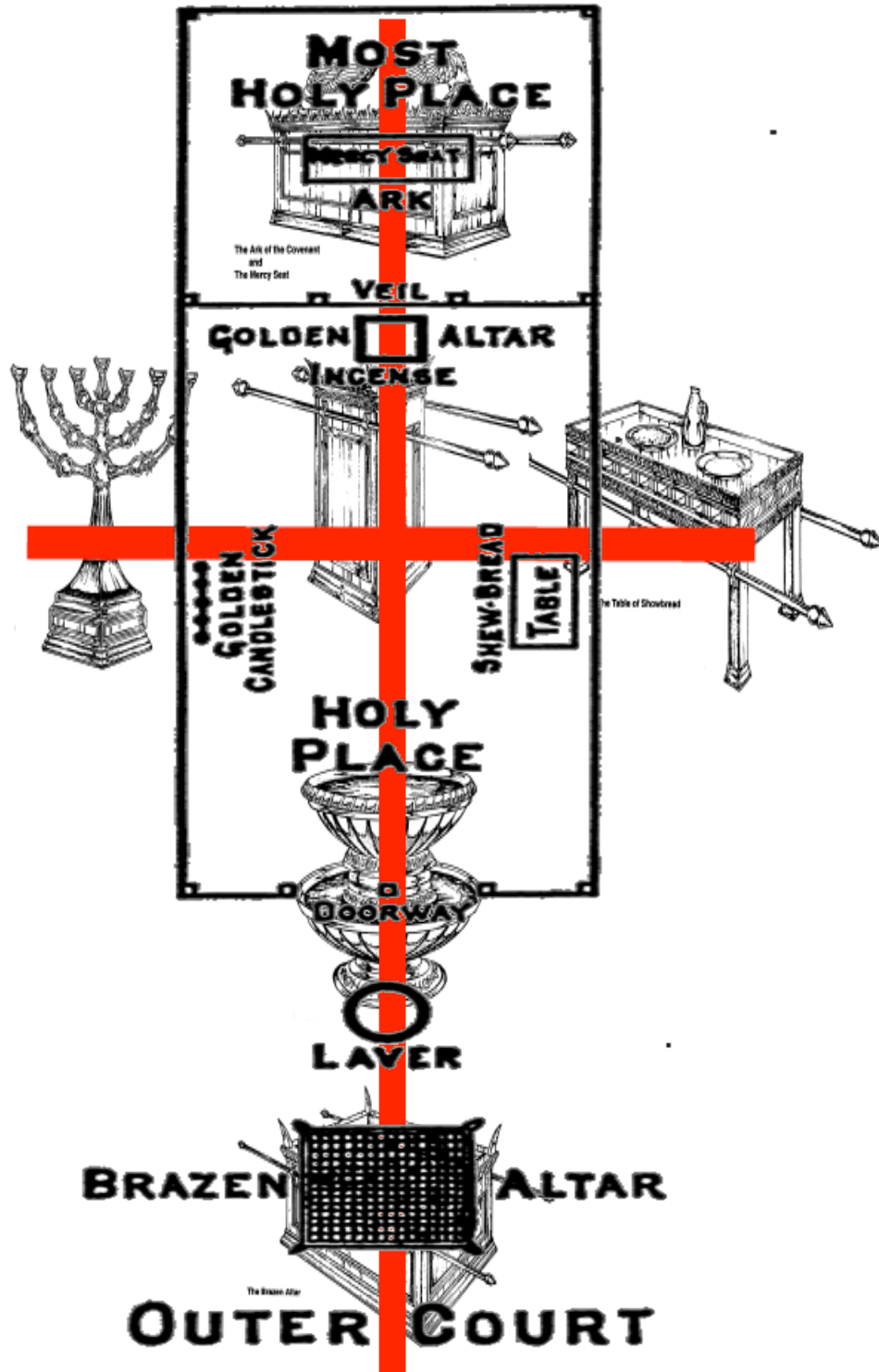

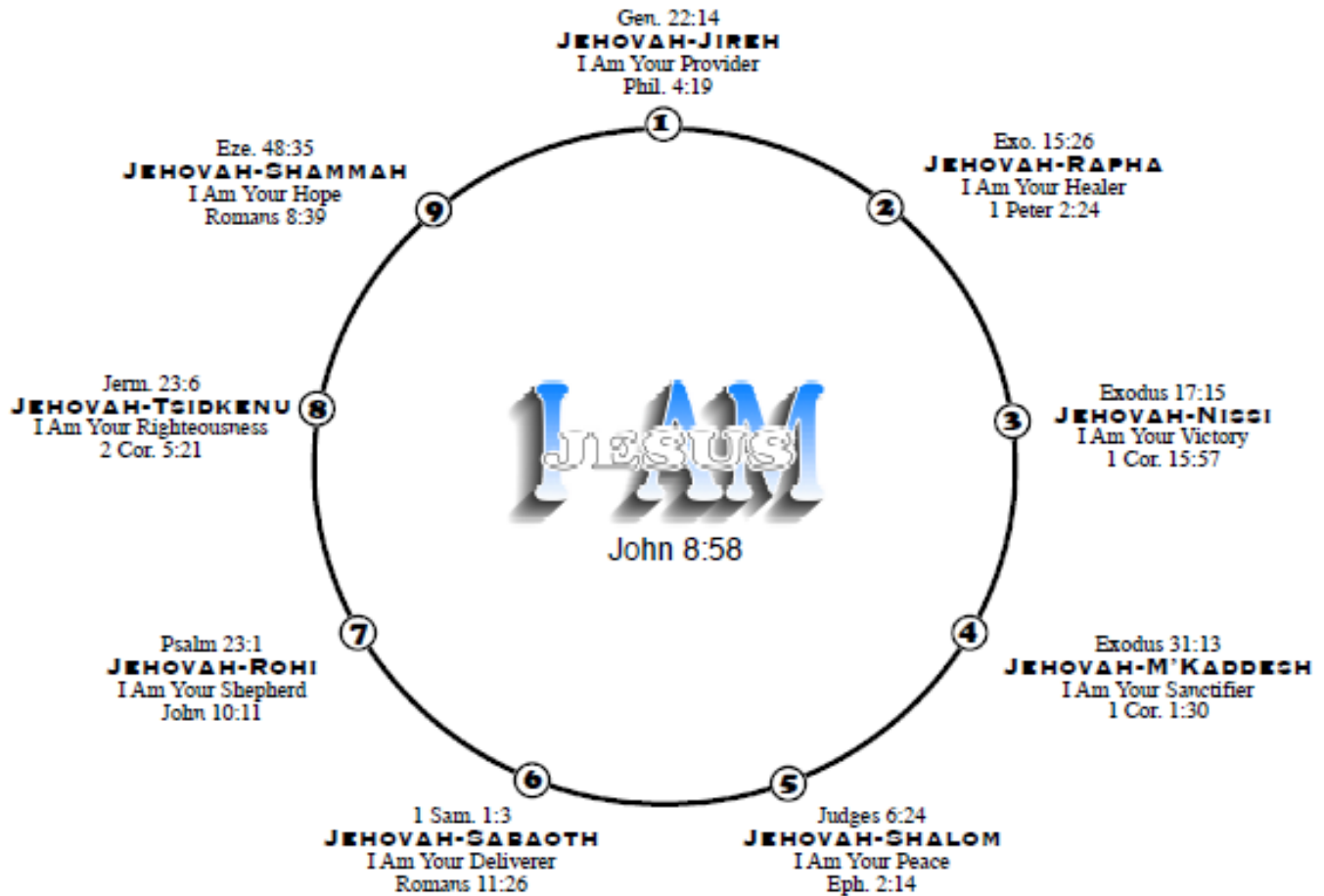

Biblical names are usually very significant. They were chosen for their meaning, or for their hopes in the destiny of the child. Quite often a name indicated the strength or weakness of place or person. Names had a meaning. This is also true of the Biblical Names of God. They reveal the nature, character, attributes of the only true and living Sovereign of the Universe.

God's Names are revealed as three primary names, then as compound names that stem from the primaries. The chart above covers the majority of the compound names in the Bible. The first four use the primary name *Elohim*, while the latter eleven have *Jehovah* as their root.

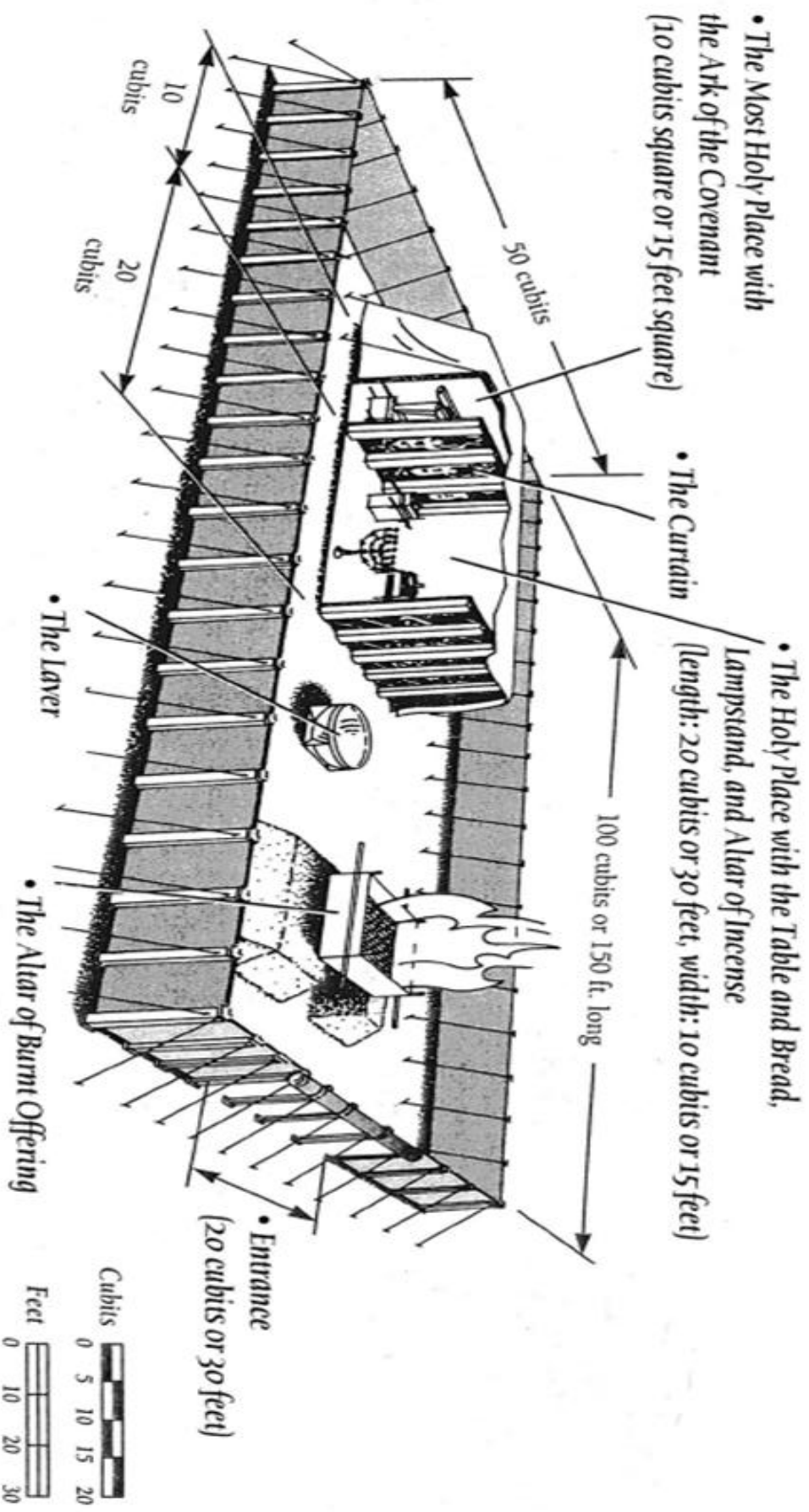
