- 1-7. Jehoiakim's captivity and Ashpenaz takes Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah
- 8-16. They refusing the king's portion do prosper with pulse and water.

- 1-9. Nebuchadnezzar, forgetting his dream, requires it of the Chaldeans, by promises and threatenings.
- 10-13. They acknowledging their inability are judged to die.
- 31-45. The dream. The interpretation

Chapter 3. our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the burning fiery furnace

- 1-7. Nebuchadnezzar dedicates a golden image in Dura.
- 8-12. Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego are accused for not worshipping the image.
- 13-18. They being threatened, make a good confession and are cast into the furnace, then God delivers them.
- 28-30. Nebuchadnezzar seeing the miracle blesses God, and advances them.

Chapter 4. The Tree Dream and The Proclamation of Nebuchadnezzar

- 1-7. Nebuchadnezzar confesses God's kingdom, relates of his dreams, which the magicians could not interpret
- 8-37. Daniel hears the dream. He interprets it. The dream fulfilled

Chapter 5. The Handwriting on the Wall... "MENE, MENE, TEKEL, PHARSIN"

- 1-9. Belshazzar's impious feast and A hand-writing unknown to the magicians, troubles the king.
- 10-29. Daniel is brought in to reprove the king of pride/idolatry, reads/interprets the writing
- 30-31. The monarchy is translated to the Medes.

Chapter 6. The Den of Lions

- 1-3. Daniel is made chief of the presidents.
- 4-9. They, conspiring against him, obtain an idolatrous decree.
- 10-23. Daniel, accused of the breach thereof, is cast into the lion's den. Daniel is saved
- 24-28. His adversaries devoured; and God magnified by a decree

Chapter 7. The Four Beasts

- 1-14. Daniel's vision of the four beasts, and of God's kingdom
- 15-28. The interpretation thereof.

Chapter 8. The Ram and the He-Goat

- 1-12. Daniel's vision of the ram and he goat.
- 13-14. The two thousand three hundred days of the suspension of the daily sacrifice.
- 15-27. Gabriel comforts Daniel, and interprets the vision.

Chapter 9. Daniel's 70 Weeks

- 1-15. Daniel, considering the time of the captivity, makes confession of sins
- 16-27. He prays for the restoration of Jerusalem and Gabriel informs him of the seventy weeks.

Chapter 10. Daniel's Vision of God's Glory

1-21. Daniel, having humbled himself, sees a vision. Being troubled with fear, he is comforted by the angel.

Chapter 11. Prophecies of the Inter-Testamental Period

- 1-29. The overthrow of Persia by the king of Grecia. Conflicts between the kings of the south and of the north
- 30-45. The invasion and tyranny of the Romans.

Chapter 12. The Great Tribulation

1-13. Michael shall deliver Israel from their troubles. Daniel is informed of the times.
