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**Date:** The period of the Judges covers about 350-400 years Judges was written sometime afterwards... c. 1043-1004 B.C.

Theme: \_\_\_Failure Through Disobedience\_\_\_\_\_

**Key Verse: Judges 17:6** *In those* <u>days</u> there was no <u>king</u> in <u>Israel</u>, but every man did that which was <u>right</u> in his <u>own</u> eyes.

Apathy in one generation (ch. 1) led to Apostasy in the next generation (ch. 2)

The Recurring Sinfulness of Man

The Persistent Mercifulness of God


The book begins with <u>Disobedience</u> (ch. 1) and ends in <u>Chaos</u> & Confusion (see Ch. 21:25)

#### Date:

1404-1390 B.C.

Three periods of time covered

- 3. Eight years divided either side of Jordan

Egypt – (the world)	Red Sea	Wilderness- (Carnality and Defeat)	Jordan River	Canaan - (Spiritual Victory)



## Author:

- Jewish tradition holds the author to be Samuel who was first in the order of the prophets and last of the judges.
- Judge = "a military chieftain" raised up by God to deliver Israel from her oppressors

#### Date:

- The period of Judges covers 350-400 years (Judges 1- Samuel 7)
- This was written sometime afterwards 1043-1004 B.C.

#### Theme:

## "FAILURE THROUGH DISOBEDIENCE"

- . The Apathy (Ch. 1) led to Apostasy (Ch.2) in the next generation! (2:10-12)
- · Two great truths evident in the times of judges:
  - The recurring sinfulness of man.
  - The persistent mercifulness of God.
- This book begins with disobedience (ch. 1) and ends in chaos and confusion (see 21:25)


### Key Verse
